Frequently Asked Questions

1. **What is the duration of the course?** – Duration of the course is decided by the participants. Each iteration takes approximately 4 to 5 hours to complete, hence participants will have to plan for approximately 50 hours for the completion of the course. A person who can commit 5 hours / week can complete this course in 10 weeks. If another person can spend 5 hours / day, then he can complete it in 10 days. We provide that flexibility to the participant.
2. **Once registered for this course for how many days is the registration valid?** – The registration is valid for 1 year from the date of registration, or your PMP certification, whichever is earlier.
3. **Does the PMP training cover the latest PMP Exam content?** Yes, it covers the PMP exam content 2021, which is the latest.
4. **Do you provide the 35 contact hours training certificate which is mandatory for writing the PMP exam?** Yes we do.
5. **Is it compulsory that only Authorized Training Providers (ATP) can conduct PMP preparatory programs?** The answer is 'No'. The following types of entities can conduct PMP preparatory programs and offer the 35 contact hours certificate. This includes;
